- All are welcomed at their meetings each month. They pin the quilt sandwich and tie with yarn. No sewing is done at monthly gathering.
- Donate backing fabric: 4 yards of never been used yardage, preferably washed
- Provide (48) 11" blocks for a quilt top (cut accurately)
- Provide and sew quilt top according to their specific measurements 6 blocks wide by 8 blocks long
- Bring specific items for donation to any HHQ Meeting and <u>Gena Hartmon will deliver to Mt. Zion Quilters.</u>
